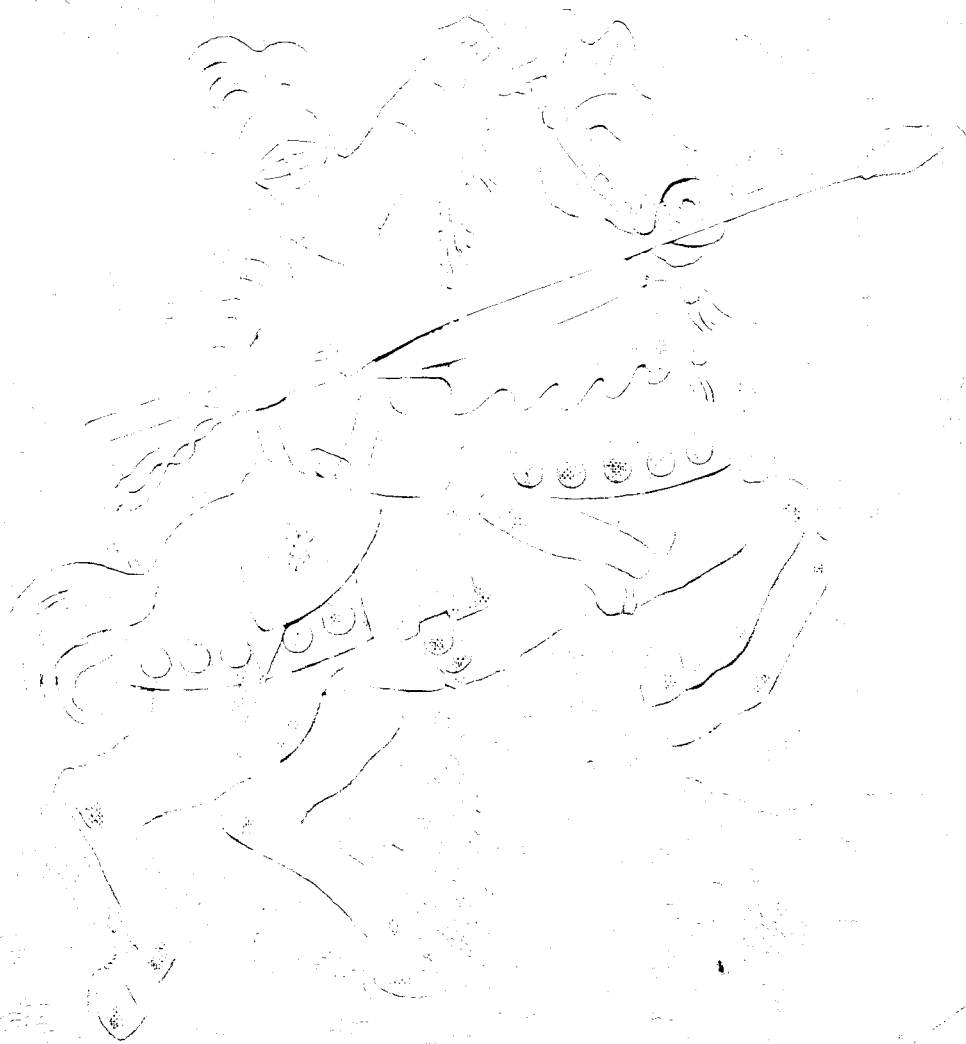
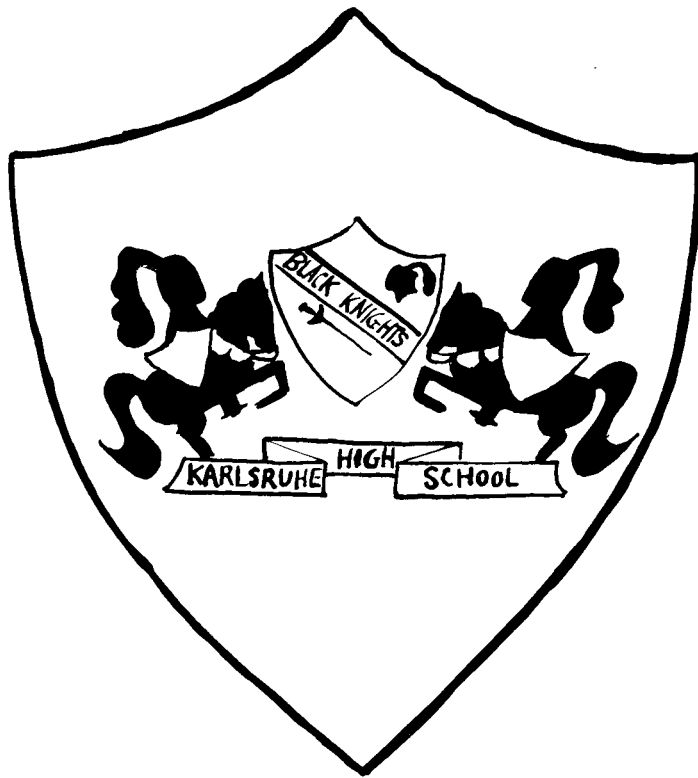

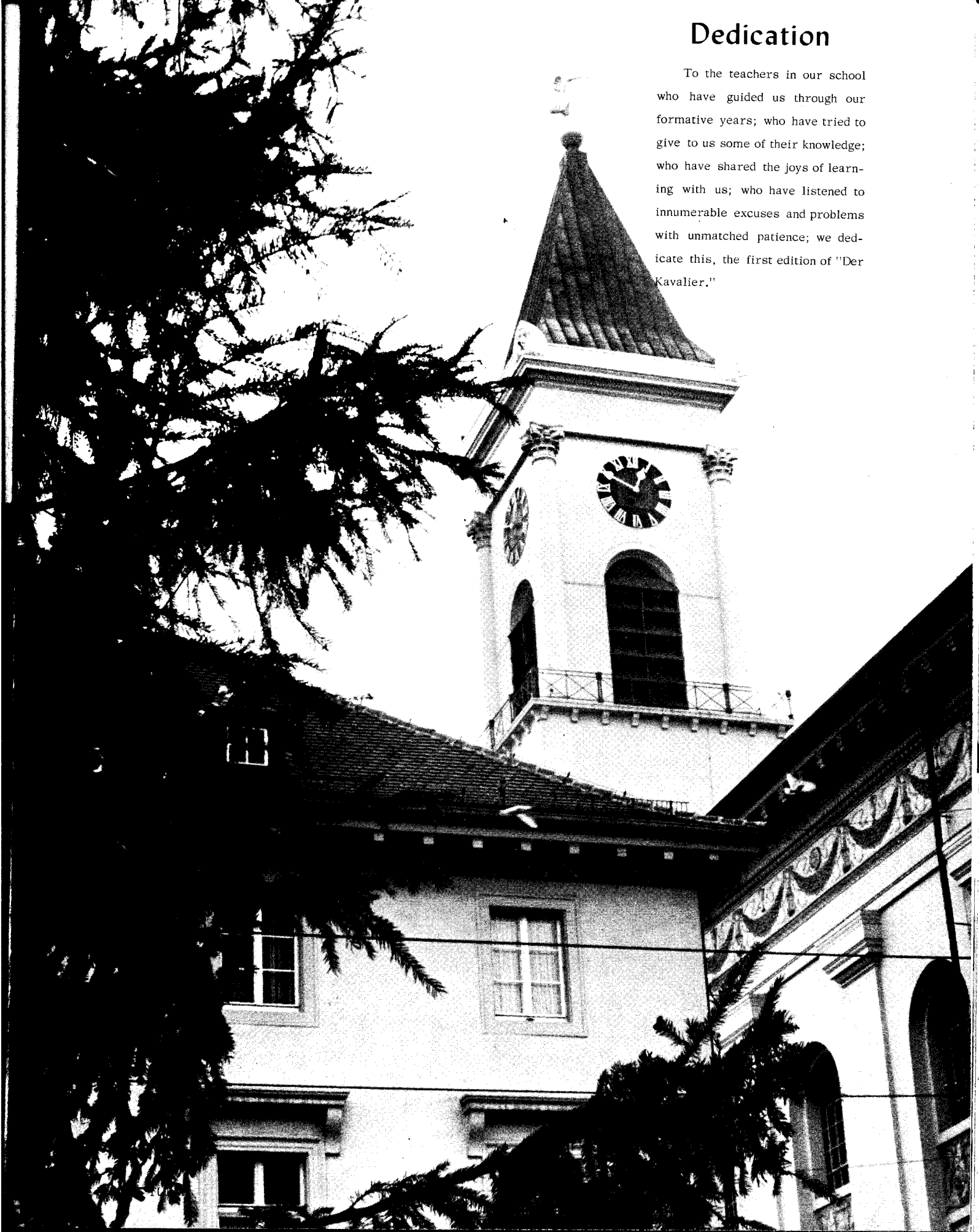
Through text and photography we, the staff of "Der Kavalier," have presented the events, places, and people we believe students of Karlsruhe High School will most want to remember in the years to come.

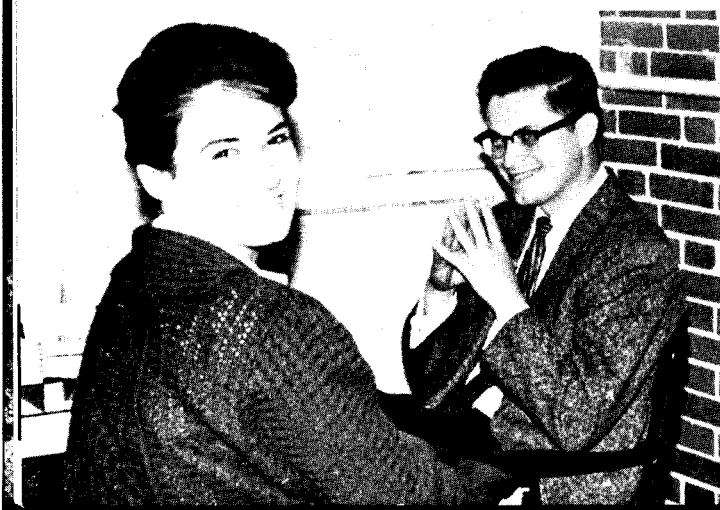
Senior Class

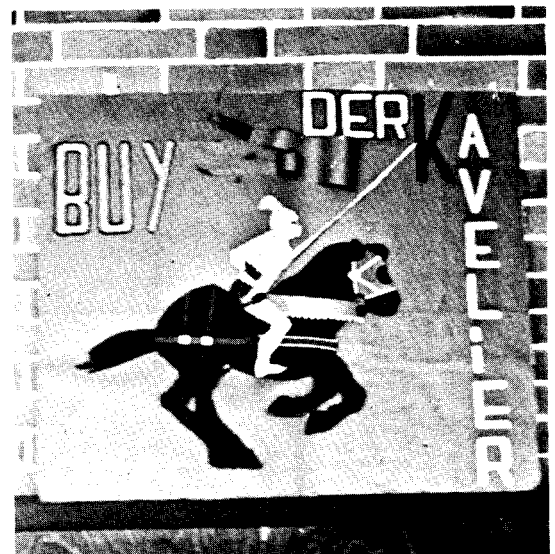

A Thanksgiving play, "A Day of Thanks," was presented in an all-school assembly as well as numerous other skits and plays during the year.

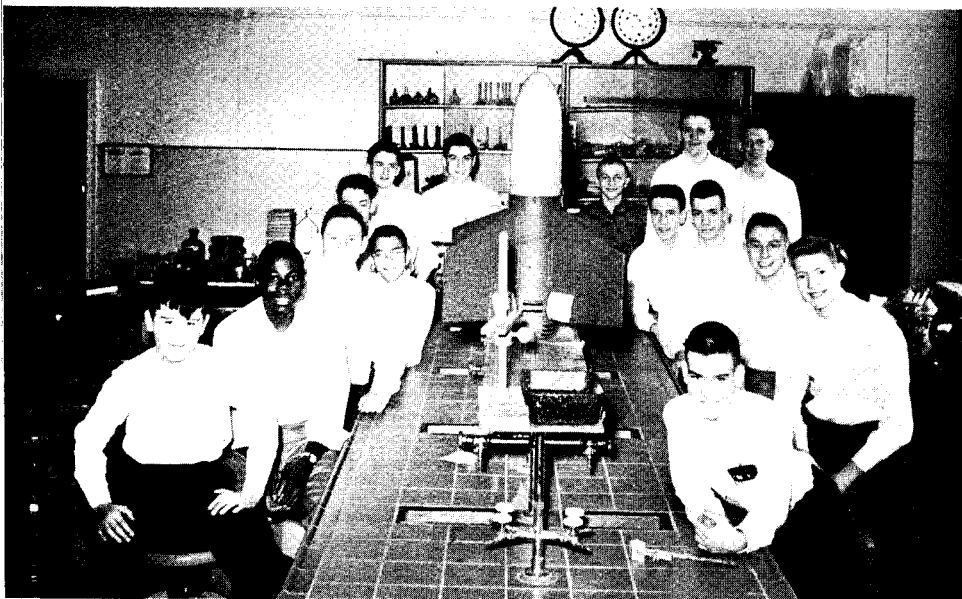

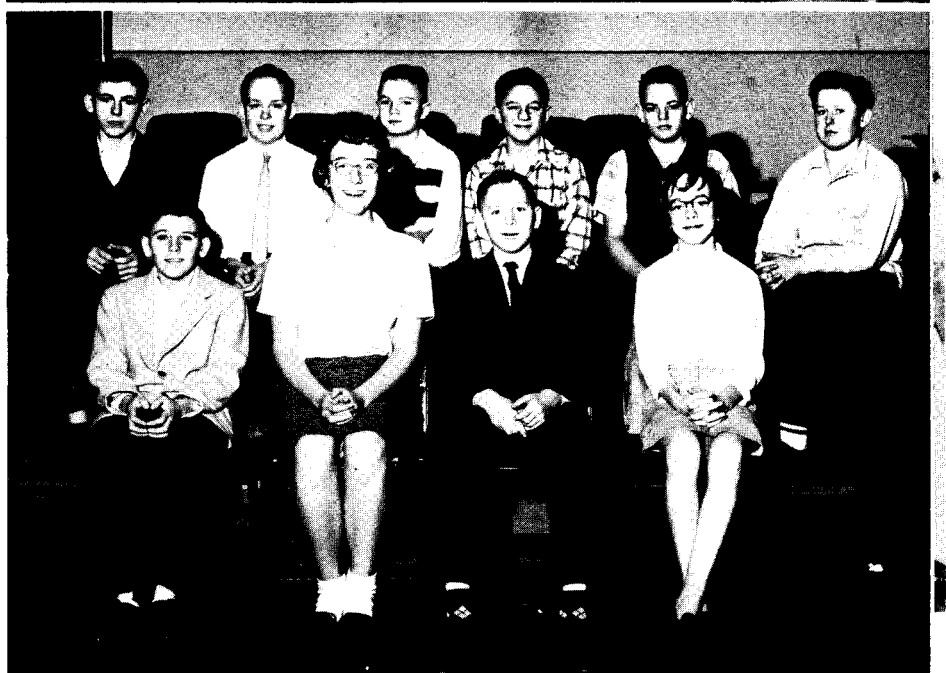

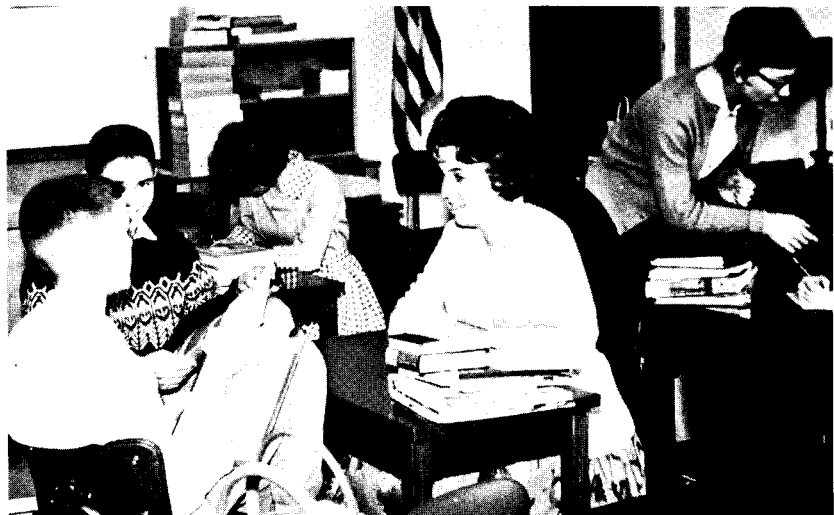

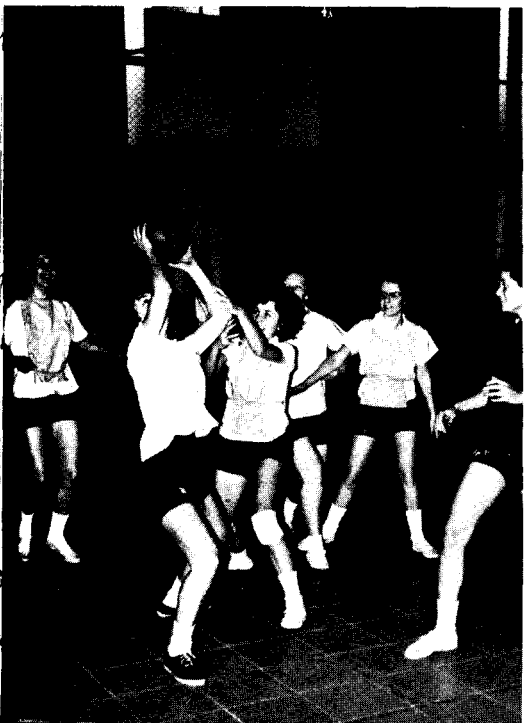

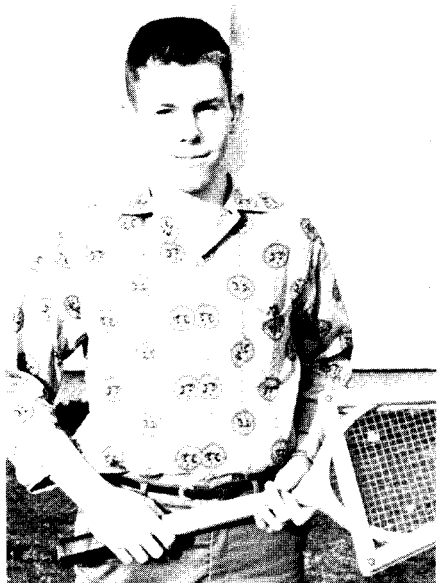
